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NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

RATHDRUM PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

The Rathdrum Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a Public Hearing on **Wednesday, April 15, 2020** commencing at 6:00 PM to hear testimony regarding a proposal to annex and zone approximately 9.75 acres of real property, generally located west of N Meyer Road, south of W Christine Street and north of W Flagstaff Street, into the city limits. The applicant proposes to zone the property R-2S Residential, which is the same as property located to the north, west and south of the subject property. The annexation will include the adjoining and extended approximately 1.4 acres of public right-of-way for Meyer Road which is currently still within County jurisdiction.

The property is within the City's exclusive Area of City Impact (ACI) and is identified as "Residential" pursuant to the City's Future Land Use Map. The property is currently zoned "Agricultural Suburban" by Kootenai County. The property is currently vacant and surrounded on three sides by property within the city limits.

As allowed by the Proclamation of the Governor of the State of Idaho dated March 13, 2020, and amendments thereto, this public hearing will be held to allow public attendance via Zoom. Details of how to connect to the meeting will be published on the City's web site www.rathdrum.org one week prior to the meeting as well on the City's Facebook page.

If you cannot attend this meeting via telecommunication device, you may provide written comment to be included in the public record to the City by no later than 5:00 PM on April 10, 2020 by mail to Attn: Cary Siess, City of Rathdrum, 8047 W Main Street, Rathdrum, ID 83835 or email at cary@rathdrum.org.

The public hearing will proceed pursuant to the process established by City Resolution 235, as follows:

1. City staff will give a brief description of the application.
2. The applicant and any technical witnesses like their engineer or other representative will have up to 15 minutes to present their information on the proposal.
3. City staff will provide their staff report.
4. Individual public testimony – from those in favor, neutral, then opposed - will be accepted up to three (3) minutes per person. Up to 15 minutes may be granted for a spokesman of a group to speak if pre-arranged.
5. The applicant will be given an opportunity to rebut and answer questions.
6. Following all testimony the Commission will deliberate on the proposal.

All individuals wishing to speak need to sign-in and provide their contact address. Testimony provided should be directed only to the subject at hand, should not be repetitive and be respectful. No further testimony from the applicant or public will be taken after close of the public hearing.
